Castledawson Presbyterian Church
BT45 8AA



Originally known as Dawson's Bridge, it was formed in 1694; the home church of the Rev James Glasgow, missionary to India.

1st Magherafelt Presbyterian Church
BT45 6BW



Originally linked with Moneymore from 1692 and then with Castledawson – became a separate church in 1738.

Union Road Magherafelt Presbyterian Church
BT45 5DF



Formed in 1868. Rev James McGranaghan became Moderator of the General Assembly, 1918-9.

1st Moneymore Presbyterian Church
BT45 7PN



Dates from 1660. First minister was Rev John Abernethy who waited on William III in London after the Revolution and was father of Rev John Abernethy, founder of the Belfast Society. Rev John Burnett became Moderator of the General Assembly 1849-50.

2nd Moneymore Presbyterian Church
BT45 7PY



A United Secession charge dating from after 1818. The Rev George Robert Thompson was suspended and restored 4 times.

Coagh Presbyterian Church
BT80 0DP



Formed in 1708 in spite of Presbytery opposition who considered that it would weaken neighbouring congregations. Probably built late 18th century during the ministry of Rev McClelland whose grave is the earliest in the graveyard. Rev Edward Marcus Dill, one of the 'Dill Worthies' was minister 1835-8.

Claggan Presbyterian Church
BT80 9UF



Originated from a Sunday School, the building opened in 1846. A manse was built in 1862 as a memorial to the Revival. The addition of a church bell as part of an 1872 extension caused controversy. Home church of Lydia Ramsay and Rev Andrew Weir, missionaries to China.
